
Now we're on to installing the theme.

Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click the "O" to the right of the Ubuntu-Drupal theme. After this click "Save Configuration."




That's all there is to it. You will now be looking at a message telling you that you have successfully installed the theme.



Configuration

Now that you have installed the theme, you will want to configure it. This theme used to have many more options for configuration but these bloated options have since moved into nicer and smaller modules.

Click the "Configure" link at the top of the "Themes" page. You will now see options for your default, previous, and current theme.



Click "Ubuntu Drupal Theme" and you will see a page similar to the following.



If you scroll down to the bottom, you will see the "Theme Specific Options." These options apply to this theme only. Although an option does not yet exist to show/hide the breadcrumb, it will exist soon enough.
